



WRITING ACCOMPLISHMENT STATEMENTS

Strong Action Verb + Specific Details + Value (Result/Purpose/How)

- Developed strong self-awareness, confidence, and global perspective while immersed in a summer-long Spanish language intensive learning abroad program.
- Quickly acclimated to a new environment and culture by embracing a curious mindset,
 tolerance for ambiguity, and excitement to explore unique new challenges.

SO, WHAT NOW? ACTION STEPS

- Identify the transferable skills students gain from your courses/programs, especially those that align with the top workforce skills of the 21st century
- Clearly articulate & openly discuss these skills with students so they will understand how they are gaining valuable skills now that will help them pursue other opportunities (internships, jobs, grad school, etc.)

REIMAGINING THROUGH INTENTIONAL COURSE DESIGN

Step One: Develop Course Learning Outcomes:

- To gain awareness of the impact of ethics and ethical decision making in the workplace
- To learn and build upon key skills and competencies that benefit résumé and career goals
- To problem solve collaboratively across diverse classmates and workplaces through questioning and critical thinking

STUDENT-DEVELOPED LEARNING OBJECTIVES

2 Ethics-based, 2 Career-based

- "I will develop a set list of 10 ethics-based questions specific to subcontractors utilizing the Daniels fund guiding principles such as integrity, transparency, fairness, trust, rule of law, viability, and respect. By (date) I will have the survey finished and submitted to my supervisor for approval. By (date) I will have identified and distributed the survey to 20 potential subcontractors via email. The subcontractors will have two full weeks to respond and I will be submitting the results of the survey to my supervisor by (date). This compilation of data is designed to help identify subcontractors with ethical standards that match their own."
- "Work to retain 90% of admitted students through evaluating the onboarding process in search for possible improvements. This will include looking back at previous semesters to research retention percentages and steps that are taken to keep students in the pipeline"


