Since its inception in 1997, the Opportunity Scholars program continues to service a growing student population who are the first in their families to attend college. The program has supported almost 900 students earning degrees from the David Eccles School of Business at the University of Utah.

The program benefits students by providing retention resources such as one-on-one academic and career counseling and mentoring from alumni, advisory board members, and business corporate. The staff members in the program also assist students with navigating life on campus, in addition to the chance to explore all aspects of the business school on one of the most beautiful college campuses in Utah.

Who are the Opportunity Scholars?

Business major:

Pre-business or majoring in one of the business majors: Accounting, Business Administration, Entrepreneurship, Finance, Information Systems, Management, Marketing, Operations & Supply Chain, Quantitative Anaysis of Markets and Organiations (QAMO).

GPA:

Maintaining a 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher

First Generation:

Students whose parents have not graduated from a four-year higher education institution. Students are the first in their immediate family to attend college.

Need:

Demonstrated financial need as evidenced through federal student aid

Students in the Program Receive the Following:

Scholarships to help cover the cost of tuition and/or books

Tutoring, mentoring, academic advising, and career coaching

Community service-learning project

Sense of community and support

Counseling

Networking opportunities
