

Symmetry: Competition and Complementarity

Two businesses A and B are complementors with respect to a customer if

$$WTP(A \& B) > WTP(A) + WTP(B)$$

They are competitors with respect to a customer if

$$WTP(A \& B) < WTP(A) + WTP(B)$$

They are complementors with respect to a supplier if

$$WTS(A \& B) < WTS(A) + WTS(B)$$

They are competitors with respect to a supplier if

$$WTS(A \& B) > WTS(A) + WTS(B)$$

Contradiction: Four Responses *

- 1. Decide that one proposition is wrong
 - 2. Force consistency across propositions
 - 3. Build a paraconsistent system of propositions
 - 4. Embrace inconsistency and its generative nature


